II – Context: mentioned mass shootings.

- **Sandy Hook Elementary School**, Newtown, Connecticut, December 14th, 2012.
Perpetrator: Adam Lanza. Casualties: 20 children (6 and 7 years old) + 6 staff members dead.
- **San Bernardino**, California, December 2nd, 2015. Terrorist attack. Casualties: 14 dead + 22 injured.
- **Orlando**, Florida, June 12th, 2016. Perpetrator: Omar Mateen. Casualties: 49 dead, 53 wounded.
- **Las Vegas Concert**, Nevada, October 17th, 2017. Perpetrator: Stephen Paddock (64 years old).
Casualties: 58 dead, 851 injured.
→ deadliest mass shooting in U.S. history. Paddock fired more than 1,100 rounds from his hotel bedroom on a crowd of concertgoers. He used bump stock, a device to help fire shots in rapid succession (like an automatic weapon).
Bump stock were banned by the U.S. Justice Department in December 2018, to be effective in March 2019.
- **Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School**, Parkland, Florida, in February 14th, 2018.
Perpetrator: Nikolas Cruz. Casualties: 14 killed, 17 injured.

III - QUESTIONS

From line 1 to 21

- 1) What is the Republican party's new direction as far as President Trump is concerned?
→ While receiving all the governors of the country at the White House after the mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School, President Trump stated that the governors should not be afraid of the NRA and launch attacks against the gun lobbies so as to meet the current violent situation with guns in America.
- 2) What is paradoxical about this statement?
Donald Trump has received a maximum of funding (a record so far) from the National Rifle association in 2016, the most influential gun lobby in the U.S.A.
- 3) Right or wrong. Tick the correct answer and justify with a quote from the text.

President Trump is the only Republican to hold this position.

“The President is hardly the only Republican to change his tune on guns in the wake of the Feb. 14 killing of 17 people in Parkland, Fla.”

- 4) Which measures have been taken?
 - To strengthen background checks rules – John Cornyn (GOP, Texas) along with Democrats.
 - A will to raise the age limit so that people of 21 (and no more 18) would be allowed to buy some weapons – Marco Rubio (GOP, Florida)
 - To arm educators – TRUMP
 - Plans to restrict high-capacity magazines (like those the shooter allegedly used) → see the 1994-2004 ban!!
- 5) Why such a reaction from the GOP?
→ After the many mass shootings, a majority of Americans are getting really fed up with the situation. The GOP has to show their citizens (and voters) they are dealing with the problem.

6) Why is MONEY a determining factor in this new political attitude?

Gun manufacturers:

→ meet an unprecedented economic crisis in decades

→ cannot fund the NRA as they used to.

The NRA, to deal with the situation:

→ “has allowed” lawmakers to launch new restrictions/limits

→ no retribution/retaliation/ “vengeance”

Final purpose:

→ to re-launch the gun makers’ production and economical boast as there is nothing better as new gun-control measures to urge the Americans to buy more guns.

- 1) What would Trump's plan to arm educators involve?
→ The NRA would make profits as it is the leader as far as safety programs are concerned. The NRA would become the natural and well-paid partner of the state to train the teachers.
- 2) What will the congressmen/women's action consist in?
→ Nothing much more than strengthening background checks again.
- 3) Recap the major blow of one of the background check bills for the Democrats.
→ The individuals with a conceal-carry license would be granted this right at the federal level (against the state level before). So the Democratic states imposing more regulations would have to accept this right and comply.
- 4) Why is it an excellent strategy for the GOP?
 - Just before the midterms = need to make the voters aware that the GOP is listening to them, that the party is not lax but considering.
 - Good for gun lobbies, in particular the NRA, and for the GOP's funding as they rely on the former to have money for their campaigns.
